**Field Hockey Player of the Week**

**Christine Mwararura, Trinity**

(Senior, Midfielder - Helensvale, Zimbabwe)

Mwararura scored both Bantam goals in a 2-0 road win at Bowdoin on Saturday afternoon. The victory marked the first win for Trinity against Bowdoin since 1997 and snapped the Polar Bears' 31-game winning streak and their 39-game home winning streak. Mwararura now has three goals and an assist through 10 outings.

**Notes:** The **2008 NESCAC Field Hockey Championship** is just around the corner. Tufts assumed sole possession of the top spot in the NESCAC standings over the weekend with a win over Williams and a Bowdoin loss to Trinity. The Polar Bears and the Jumbos have already secured a home quarterfinal contest in this year's playoffs, and four teams are fighting for the remaining two home quarterfinal games. Middlebury and Trinity only need one more win to solidify their hosting duties in the first round, while Amherst and Williams both need to win out in addition to getting some help from other NESCAC squads in order for them to host. The Jeffs and the Ephs will clash this Saturday in Amherst. The NESCAC Field Hockey Championship features an important change for 2008, as for the first time eight teams will qualify for the playoffs with the quarterfinals commencing on Sunday, Nov. 2...**Amherst** first year goalkeeper Emily Vitale (Cheshire, Conn.) made nine saves while allowing only one goal during a 2-0 week for the Jeffs. Amherst has now won its last four games...**Bates** junior midfielder Morgan Maciewicz (Marblehead, Mass.) netted a goal and an assist in the Bobcats' 8-1 win over Southern Maine on Wednesday...**Bowdoin** had its 31-game winning streak and the nation's longest home winning streak of 39 games snapped in a 2-0 loss to Trinity on Saturday. The Polar Bears had not lost at Ryan Field dating back to October of 2004...**Colby** junior forward Amy Campbell (North Andover, Mass.) had three goals in a 1-2 week for the Mules. On Thursday at St. Joseph's (ME), Campbell had both goals in a 3-2 overtime loss. She netted the game-winner in a 2-1 overtime victory over Connecticut College on Saturday...**Connecticut College** sophomore forward Abby Hine (Madison, Conn.) tallied her team-leading ninth goal of the season at Colby on Saturday. Hanna Wagner assisted on the score, notching the first point of her career in the process...**Middlebury's** Sophie Thompson (Greenwich, Conn.) netted four goals in the Panthers' 9-0 win over Bates on Saturday...**Tufts** sophomore Tamara Brown scored her 15th goal of the season in the Jumbos' 3-1 win over Williams on Saturday, the second-highest total in program history behind Ileana Casellas-Katz's 18 achieved in 2007...**Williams** first year Meera Sivalingam (Philadelphia, Pa.) tallied the game-winning goal - her first collegiate goal - in the Ephs' 2-1 win at Colby on Sunday.
