**Field Hockey Player of the Week**

**Gina Dinallo, Trinity**

(Sophomore, Goalkeeper - West Hartford, Conn.)

Dinallo stood tall in net for the Bantams during a 2-0 week, making 20 saves while allowing only one goal. At Williams on Wednesday evening, Dinallo made 13 stops to help her team post a 2-1 victory, the first loss for the Ephs in conference play this season. She made another seven saves on Saturday at home against Connecticut College in a 3-0 victory, her fourth shutout of the season. Dinallo has played every minute of every game in net so far this year for Trinity, as she sports an .890 save percentage and a 0.88 goals against average.

**Notes: The 2009 NESCAC Field Hockey Championship** is just around the corner. Trinity and Tufts are neck-and-neck heading into the final weeks of the season, and the two will tangle this Saturday in Medford, Mass. Before that happens, the Jumbos will host Connecticut College for a mid-week matchup on Wednesday. While nothing has been finalized yet, the Bantams, Jumbos and Ephs have a leg up on the competition in securing home field for the quarterfinals on Sunday, Nov. 1. Other important matches this week include Bates at Wesleyan, as both teams need a win to keep their postseason hopes alive...**Amherst** senior forward Haley Douds (South Orange, N.J.) had three goals to help the Jeffs earn a 4-2 win over Middlebury on Saturday...**Bates** senior midfielder Morgan Maciewicz (Marblehead, Mass.) assisted on both of the Bobcats' goals during a 5-2 setback on Saturday at Williams. Maciewicz is second for Bates in scoring with three goals and three assists...**Bowdoin's** Katie Herter (Topsfield, Mass.) scored two goals and assisted on another in a 5-1 win over Colby on Wednesday...**Connecticut College** sophomore defender Jess Lewis (Rutland, Vt.) recorded a defensive save on Saturday during a 3-0 setback at Trinity...**Middlebury** first year Lauren Greer (North Hampton, N.H.) tallied two goals along with an assist over two outings last week for the Panthers...**Tufts** junior forward Melissa Burke (Walpole, Mass.) netted five of the Jumbos' 16 goals during a 2-0 showing last week. Burke had two goals in a 9-0 win at Wellesley on Tuesday before scoring three more in a 7-0 victory against Colby on Saturday. The hat trick was the first of Burke's career. Junior Tamara Brown (Annandale, Va.) set the program's all-time scoring record on Saturday, contributing three goals and an assist. She now has 43 goals and 12 assists for 98 points, moving past Aryn Landau, who had 97 points from 1987-90...**Wesleyan** first year goalkeeper Tori Redding (Guilford, Conn.) combined for 20 saves over two victories last week for the Cardinals. After earning her first career shutout with two stops in a 3-0 win over Eastern Conn. St. on Thursday, Redding made a career-high 18 saves through regulation and two overtime periods followed by five stops over two penalty stroke rounds in a 3-2 victory against Bowdoin on Saturday. Saturday's win snapped a six-game losing streak to the Polar Bears...**Williams** senior midfielder Whitney Thayer (Lancaster, Pa.) had two goals for the Ephs during a 1-1 week, scoring the lone tally in a 2-1 setback to Trinity on Wednesday followed by the game's first goal in a 5-2 win over Bates on Saturday.
