Field Hockey Co-Players of the Week

Chase Delano, Middlebury

(Junior, Forward - Greenwich, Conn.)
 Delano tallied five goals in helping the Panthers to a 2-0 week on the road. At St. Lawrence on Wednesday, Delano scored the game-winning goal in a 6-5 victory. She then netted four goals on Saturday as Middlebury earned a 7-1 win at Bates. Delano now has six goals and six assists for 14 points through 12 games.

Gina Dinallo, Trinity

(Sophomore, Goalkeeper - W. Hartford, Conn.)
 Dinallo backboned the Bantams to two victories last week along with the top seed in the 2009 NESCAC Field Hockey Championship. She recorded eight saves in a 3-0 win at Springfield on Wednesday, then stopped 13 shots in a 2-1 victory over Bowdoin on Saturday, as Trinity was outshot by a 21-3 margin.

Notes: With a 2-1 win over Bowdoin on Saturday, Trinity secured the top seed for the **2009 NESCAC Field Hockey Championship** and the best finish in program history in the NESCAC standings. The Bantams reached the tournament semifinals for the first time ever a year ago, falling to Tufts 1-0 in overtime. The Jumbos have also cemented their playoff spot with a win this past weekend and will be the number-two seed. Both Trinity and Tufts will host a quarterfinal contest this Sunday, Nov. 1. Three teams are still in the hunt for the final two first round home contests - Amherst, Middlebury, and Williams. The winner of Friday's Ephs-Panthers tilt is guaranteed hosting duties. The Jeffs, meanwhile, may be rooting for the rival Ephs on Friday, as a win by Williams ensures Amherst the right to host no matter how its game at Trinity turns out. The final playoff spot will go to either Colby or Wesleyan. A win by the Cardinals guarantees them a trip to the postseason...**Amherst** senior M/F Haley Douds (South Orange, N.J.) had two goals during a 3-0 win over Wesleyan on Saturday. She leads the Jeffs in scoring with 10-1-21. Amherst has won five consecutive outings and is 10-3 for the first time since 2001...**Bates** senior midfielder Morgan Maciewicz (Marblehead, Mass.) scored the lone goal for the Bobcats in a 7-1 setback on Saturday...**Bowdoin's** Kara Kelley (Dedham, Mass.) tallied her fourth goal of the season in a 2-1 loss at Trinity...**Connecticut College** sophomore forward Hanna Wagner (Sudbury, Mass.) scored a goal in each half to lead the Camels to a 3-1 win over Colby on Saturday...**Tufts** senior forward Michelle Kelly (Downingtown, Pa.) played a part in the first two goals during a 3-0 win at Williams, recording an assist followed by a goal. Earlier in the week, Kelly recorded a goal and two assists during a 9-0 win over Gorder...**Wesleyan** junior Alex Bean (Milton, Mass.) collected both Cardinal goals in a 2-0 victory at Salve Regina on Tuesday, while first year Ashley McLaren (Essex Junction, Vt.) and sophomore Morgan McCauley (Rye, N.Y.) each had a goal and an assist in a 3-0 win over Mt. Holyoke on Thursday. Rookie netminder Tori Redding (Guilford, Conn.) tied a career-high with 18 stops in a 3-0 setback at Amherst on Saturday...**Williams** junior goalkeeper Katrina Tulla (New Canaan, Conn.) made 26 saves during an 0-2 week, stopping 12 shots in a 2-0 mid-week loss at Union before turning aside 14 in a 3-0 setback to Tufts.
