#### Men's Lacrosse Player of the Week

##### **Harper Cullen, Trinity**

(Junior, Attacker - Rehoboth Beach, Del.)

Cullen led the Bantams in scoring during a 2-0 week, tallying nine goals. On Wednesday at Eastern Conn. St., Cullen scored all of his game-high four goals in the third quarter, leading Trinity back from a 6-2 halftime deficit for a 7-6 advantage heading into the fourth that the Bantams would not relinquish. In a key 11-6 win at Bates on Saturday, Harper paced his squad once again with five more scores. He also contributed three ground balls during the week.

**Notes:** The final two weeks of the regular season will provide plenty of excitement before the start of the **2009 NESCAC Men's Lacrosse Championship**. Middlebury took a big step in securing the number-one seed for the second year in a row with a win over Tufts on Saturday. Bowdoin will travel to Colby in a mid-week tilt with both squads needing a win in order to have a shot at hosting a home quarterfinal contest. The 2009 NESCAC Men's Lacrosse Championship features an important change with eight teams competing in the tournament field for the first time...**Amherst** senior defender Chris Fitzpatrick (Fort Salonga, N.Y.) had five ground balls and caused a handful of turnovers in a 6-5 setback to Wesleyan on Saturday...**Bates** sophomore midfielder Rory Cosgrove (Pittsburgh, Pa.) had two goals and an assist in an 11-6 loss to Trinity on Saturday...**Bowdoin** senior Cullen Winkler (Milton, Mass.) had three goals and an assist in the Polar Bears' 10-9 mid-week loss to Endicott...**Colby** senior attacker Caddy Brooks (Darien, Conn.) netted three goals and four assists during a 1-1 week for the Mules. Brooks now has 17 goals and 19 assists for 36 points...**Connecticut College** junior attacker Steve Dachille (Garden City, N.Y.) tallied three goals and added three assists in the Camels' picked up a 14-8 win over Colby on Saturday. It was the seventh-straight victory for Connecticut College over Colby...**Middlebury** senior midfielder Mike Stone (Boston, Mass.) had nine goals, an assist, and 13 ground balls as the Panthers went 2-0 last week. Stone scored six goals for the second consecutive game during an 11-6 win against Rensselaer on Wednesday...**Tufts** sophomore D.J. Hessler (Monkton, Md.) collected five goals and three assists in the Jumbos' 15-4 win over WNEC on Tuesday. He chipped in two more helpers in a setback at Middlebury on Saturday, bringing his season total to 34, just one shy of the single-season program record set by Bryan Griffin in 2004...**Wesleyan** junior attacker Jon Killeen (Derry, N.H.) tallied six goals for the Cardinals over two victories last week. Killeen netted four in a mid-week win over Western Conn. St., then added a pair of third quarter markers in a 6-5 win at Amherst on Saturday, extending the Cardinals' winning streak over the Lord Jeffs to 12 games. Senior netminder Mike Borrero made 12 saves in the victory...**Williams** freshman attacker Sam Hargrove (Wallingford, Pa.) had five points on four goals and an assist in two Eph wins last week, scoring two goals in each outing. Against Bowdoin on Saturday, Hargrove had two goals and an assist, burying the game-winner to give Williams a 10-7 decision.
